Using the four dimensions of the Felder-Silverman learning styles model (1988), this guide presents an activity geared to education an individual on an electronic health records (EHR) system.

<b>ADVS</b> Host a guided group session using the EHR following a flow chart	<b>ADVG</b> In a group, organize a step-by-step EHR usage chart using pictures	<b>ADWS</b> Group project to write out a step-by-step EHR usage instruction manual	<b>ADWG</b> Group presentation on a step-by-step method for the EHR
<b>AIVS</b> Host a group exercise where an EHR usage flow chart is developed	<b>AIVG</b> Work with a group to create a functioning EHR simulator	<b>AIWS</b> Group exercise writing out steps on an innovative way to use the EHR	<b>AIWG</b> Group exercise to develop a creative approach to working in the EHR
<b>RDVS</b> Independently work in the live EHR system to develop a flow chart	<b>RDVG</b> Independently diagram the benefits for using the EHR	<b>RDWS</b> Rewrite out the proven steps on how to use the EHR	<b>RDWG</b> Independently design a how-to presentation on the EHR
<b>RIVS</b> Independently develop an EHR usage flow-chart with sequential steps	<b>RIVG</b> Independently develop an EHR comparison with another EHR	<b>RIWS</b> Independently write out steps on an innovative way to use the EHR	<b>RIWG</b> Work alone and write a novel approach to working in the EHR

**Key:** Active (A) vs. Reflective (R); Direct (Sensing) (D) vs. Intuitive (I); Visual (V) vs. Words (Verbal) (W); and, Sequential (S) vs. Global (G)
