 With Amanda Condra (Iowa State University), I gained access to female sexual offender data of individuals currently in the Iowa Sexual Offender Registry. We were able to develop some general profile characteristics from this data.

Challacombe, D. J.: Sovereign Citizen Violence from 2004 to 20142015As a preliminary study, I identified approximately violent sovereign citizen incidents which occurred between 2004 and 2014. I
conducted data exploits to identify salient demographics and other data.

Administered pre- and post- surveys to University of Kansas Medical Center Information Resources department employees who had participated in a three-week fitness education seminar. Utilized REDCap to administer the survey.

Challacombe, D. J.: Using the TRAP-18 to Understand Sovereign Citizen Violence

Collaborating with Dr. Paul Lucas (FHSU Criminology Department) and Ariana Fisher (FHSU), I identified both violent and nonviolent incidents of US-based sovereign citizens which occurred between 2004 and 2014. After using open sources to exploit details on the incidents, we filled out the Terrorist Radicalization Assessment Protocol (TRAP-18; Meloy & Gill, 2016) to determine if this screening tool was useful against US-based domestic terrorists.

Challacombe, D. J.: Assessing Cult Warning Signs 2017 – 2018 In collaboration with Haley Gray (FHSU), we conducted a qualitative study to identify warning signs of potential cults groups by

interviewing several former members.

Challacombe, D. J.: Homosexual Male Attractions 2017 – 2019 Using momentum from a 2016 survey, I am working on documenting this data and a 2018 follow-up survey on who likes whom using a Gay male population. 2017 – 2019
